

Melbourne Update:



Carisbrook Enterprises Team Member Profile: Melinda Brown – Financial Controller






Safety Tip: Traffic Management



Please check with your supervisor for instructions relating to your particular distribution and pick up points. If you work in WA and drop off/ pick up at the Malaga Distribution Centre, some of the key safety tips for safe passage of vehicles are as follows:

- Forklift dirvers to 'honk' to alert other drivers and pedestrians of their presence
- Staff in high traffic areas to wear high vis, and appropriate shoes
- No access to coned off areas while receivables/dispatch are taking place
- Drivers of large vehicles to report to Phil Kirk, Warehouse Supervisor
- Speed limits are 10km/hr
